Artist Biographies

Serouj "Midus" Aprahamian is Assistant Professor of Dance at the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign. He has been active in hip-hop dance since 1997, gaining notoriety under the name Midus for his unique, abstract style. In 2002, he helped produce a highly influential experimental dance video called Detours and, together with his group Style Elements Crew, has contributed to such cross-cutting concepts as threading, tracing, freeze framing, and mannequinism. He has taught, performed, and judged at leading hip-hop events throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, and Eurasia, and given workshops and presentations at universities throughout North America. Jeff Kolar is a sound artist, composer, and founder of Radius, an experimental radio broadcast platform established in 2010. His work, described as "wonderfully strange" (John Corbett) and "characteristically curious" (Marc Weidenbaum), activates sound in unconventional, temporary, and ephemeral ways. His solo and collaborative installations and performances often investigate the mundane sonic nuances of everyday electronic devices. His work has been exhibited internationally at the Smithsonian Museum, Museum of Arts and Design, CTM Festival for Adventurous Music (Berlin, Germany), Tsonami Festival de Arte Sonoro (Valparaíso, Chile), Radio Revolten Radio Art Festival (Halle/Salle, Germany), and reviewed in The New York Times, The Wire Magazine, Red Bull Music Academy, and more. He has ongoing collaborations with Anna Friz, Jennifer Monson, Zeena Parkins, jonCates, and NRRF Radio. http://jeffkolar.us@jeffkolar on socials. Jennifer Monson explores experimental strategies in choreography, improvisation and collaboration. Through multiyear creation processes her works have investigated animal navigation and migration (BIRD BRAIN 2000 - 2005), urban infrastructure (iMAP/Ridgewood Reservoir 2007), geological formations and watersheds (TheMahomet Aquifer Project and SIP 2009 - 10), circadian rhythms (bend the even 2018) and the impacts of Hurricanes Maria and Sandy on the coasts of Manhattan, NYC and Puerto Rico (Choreographies of Disaster2020 - 22). Her current project move thing researches the movement of toxicity. She is the founder and artistic director of iLAND - interdisciplinary Laboratory for Art Nature and Dance.

Sabina Bočková (*1995) is a choreographer and dancer based in Brno (Czech Republic). She studied classical and modern dance at Dance Center Prague and after dancing in ballet companies for three years (South Bohemian Ballet, Prague Chamber Ballet) she shifted her viewpoint on dance and decided to work as a freelance artist. Since 2019 she creates her own authorial works in POCKETART collective. In 2019, together with Johana Pocková she created a duet The Lion's Den, which has been nominated at the 26th edition of the Czech Dance Platform and has been selected in the AerowavesTwenty21. This work was inspired by mass media and political populism. The same year she created another duet in collaboration with Slovak performer Tomáš Janypka songlines: expedition 97/18, a piece which delves into the loss of a close one. In 2020 together with Johana Pocková and Inga Zotova-Mikshina she created another full evening piece Treatment of Remembering, which tackles the topic of environmental pollution. Treatment of Remembering won the International Jury Award and the Audience Award at the 27th edition of the Czech Dance Platform and it was selected for the AerowavesTwenty22. With the duet The Lion's Den she took part in the European project for young audience Shape It!. In 2022 together with Jazmína Piktorová, she created a duet Microworlds selected for AerowavesTwenty24. In 2024 together with Johana Pocková she premiered a piece for 8 female dancers and 2 musicians Fairy Tales, which is an Upscalling coproduction of Big Pulse Dance Alliance. Alongside her own work she has collaborated as a performer with the Tantehorse company, the company tYhle and choreographer Marie Gourdain and most recently with Cirk La Putyka. Fascinated by simple and obvious body language, she transforms movement through choreographic structures while at the same time addressing topics and themes that echo social and cultural issues.

Soňa Kúdelová works on the contemporary dance scene in Slovakia as a freelance choreographer, dancer, performer, cultural worker and occasional teacher based in Bratislava. She studied dance at the conservatory in Banská Bystrica and later she studied at the Department of Aesthetics, Comenius University in Bratislava. The theoretical study was aimed at finding parallels of dance and other fields of art in the historical context. She completed her master studies with the work "Analysis of Movement in Wim Wenders Pina movie" and "Postmodern Dance Art and Its Reflections in the Fine Arts". By drawing from everyday performativity, she gains experience and knowledge of how to grasp herself, in the tangle of today's society, as well as substantial motivation and creative spontaneity in the creative process. Through constant research of the body and mind, evolving over time, she moves in the topics of socio-psychological adaptation, interpersonal relationships, or society, in her daily practice. She creates collective collaborations with visual, musical and intermediate artists and they test the boundaries of artistic expressions in the same time and space. In addition to everyday life and human character, she continues to be inspired by theoretical texts, studies and essays on art and society. She has created three solo dance productions as a trilogy – "Autopilot" (2018), "Autocorrect" (2019) and "Autonomy" (2021), and a collective research project "Sound of Silence" (2019-2020, 2023). Her latest work is the trio "Intensive Tense" (premiere in December 2024) where she immersed herself in the double position of choreographer and performer. She is the founder of ngo CHAOSMOS (together with visual artist Boris Vitázek). She is member of the board of PLAST – Slovak Contemporary Dance Platform and Coordinator of Dance Residency Centre TELOCVIČŇA cultivated by PLAST.
